Accreditation Advisory Committee Annual Report 2021-2022

OVERVIEW

The annual report provides a summary of the Accreditation Advisory Committee's (AAC) operations since commencement in May 2021.

According to its <u>Bylaws</u>, AAC provides leadership for the overall direction of, and support for, programme accreditation and associated initiatives. The Committee's current membership is presented in Appendix 1.

KEY ITEMS ON THE AGENDA

The main items discussed by the Committee during the course of the year included:

1. Accreditation Timeline

The accreditation timeline proposed by relevant Schools and considered by AAC is outlined in Appendix 2.

2. Curriculum Revisions

The programme revisions have been implemented to align with the requirements of relevant accrediting bodies, in particular pertaining to the programme and course learning outcomes.

Detailed information on modified programmes is available in the <u>Academic</u> Quality Committee Annual Report.

3. Assurance of Learning (AoL)

Evidencing students' achievement of learning outcomes by Schools has included:

- development of approaches to AoL in accordance with the requirements of relevant accrediting bodies;
- development of Performance Indicators (ABET accreditation);
- curriculum mapping and assessment.

4. Addressing Other Accreditation Requirements

AAC members recognised the importance of:

- continuous improvement a documented process for assessing and evaluating the extent to which the student outcomes are being attained;
- establishment of Industrial Advisory Boards (ABET).

5. Institutional Support and Sharing Good Practice

AAC members, Academic Quality Enhancement and Institutional Research and Analytics (IR&A) shared the experiences and resources pertaining to accreditation process (e.g. the use of IR&A data outputs for indirect evidence of AoL).

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FUTURE STEPS

The Committee recommended:

- acquisition of a curriculum management software;
- provision of additional administrative support;
- building the awareness of accreditation requirements amongst faculty members and providing relevant support.

The Committee plans to continue addressing generic and specific requirements of accrediting bodies and Schools' needs.
